### <u>Young Engineers and Scientists of Derbyshire</u> <u>Design Challenge Competition - Derby University</u>

Year 7 students visited Derby University to compete in the  $47^{\rm th}$  annual Young Engineers and Scientists of Derbyshire 'Mind the Gap' competition.

They were tasked with designing a bridge to enable an electric train to cross over a ravine using problem solving, creativity and accuracy.

Maya T was awarded the Tony Claridge award for enthusiasm for Year 7&8 students, beating eight different schools from across Derbyshire.

It was a fantastic day for all involved, and experiencing a day in a university setting was very insightful. The three teams competed admirably across the day and were a credit to Tibshelf

#### **School Sustainability Project**

The day started with discussions around what sustainability is and what might make a building or area sustainable. They then completed their research before building a model of their school using a variety of recycled materials.

Our students continue to shine in PE and Sport, not just through participation but also through leadership and learning.

In addition, our BTEC Sport students have been demonstrating exceptional practical ability as part of their Level 2 BTEC Tech Award in Sport (2022). They've taken ownership of delivering structured warm-ups and isolated practices with outstanding professionalism and subject knowledge. Their confidence and coaching skills have impressed staff and peers alike, and these experiences are providing valuable preparation for future careers in sport, fitness, and education.










### **Transition Week - History**




Make sure your notifications are turned on!

Arbor- learn about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log in to Arbor to see and update your child's information. You can find all the details on your students' trips, attendance, and positive and negative marks through the Arbor app.

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop), and you can download the Arbor App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App, or the Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, to safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

#### No Mobile Phones

If your student is to bring their mobile phone into school, it **MUST** be switched off and put away in their bag.



If they are seen with a mobile phone on the school site, at any point throughout the school day, including social times, it will be confiscated and stored in the Focus Room. It will be available to collect at the end of that day. If a student persistently breaches this policy, it will be viewed as defiance and escalation up the behaviour ladder will commence.



# Uniform and PE kit expectations

Students should arrive at school in full school uniform every day, including ties and blazers.

Please also be reminded of our uniform policy, which stipulates that jeans/jeggings are not permitted, neither are trainers, hoodies, or face piercings, including clear/skin-colored retainers in the nose. Pupils will be required to remove such items.

We are required by Health and Safety guidance to keep rooms well-ventilated, which can make rooms colder than they would normally be, so we have taken some measures to mitigate against this.

No coats are to be worn in lessons.



## Attendance and Illness at school



#### Reminder from our Attendance Officer

If we have not had communication regarding an absence before 8.30am this will be recorded on your child's Arbor as an unauthorised absence.

Students are required to be in tutor time for 8:30am, anyone not present will receive a late mark.

#### Illness at school

If your child is ill during the school day, they need to speak to their teacher, and a First Aider/Medical Officer will be contacted. If they feel that they are too unwell to stay in school, the first aider will contact parents/carers.

If your child is on medical evidence, then the First Aider/Medical Officer will seek their Head of Years' permission.

Students should NOT contact home without the permission of their Head of Year.

#### **Medication in school**


If your child needs to take medication during school time, please fill in the required form, which is available on our website, from reception, or send a letter with instructions and a signature.
