cost of production.










Create a mind map of factors that are causing damage to the environment

- **≻**Loss of habitiats





- Also carry out research into banners, t-shirt designs and posters, with reference to 2D techniques used such as:
- prints / Motifs
- text
- materials
- colour and texture
- production costs.

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• Present your research using the most appropriate format, such as photographs, drawings and samples, clearly presented in your sketchbook with supporting annotations.

Developing your ideas

 Select one of the three options and present a design proposal to the group. Based on the feedback you get, develop design ideas for your final piece.

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 When developing your final piece consider the needs of the client and how your design promotes the theme of 'Protecting our Local Environment'. Design development must be supported with samples, experiments with materials and supporting notes, including consideration of working safely in the studio.
