## A Parent Governor:

## Should possess:

- A genuine interest in the future of all children
- A desire to make a positive difference
- A willingness to accept responsibility
- The ability to work collaboratively as part of a team, and a readiness to ask questions, listen, and learn
- The skills to contribute to effective governance and the success of the school or at least the capacity and willingness to develop these skills

## Will:

- Act with integrity, objectivity, and honesty in the best interests of the school
- Fulfil a primarily strategic role in the running of the school
- Visit the school and engage with its community in accordance with the agreed visits protocol
- Work in partnership with the Headteacher to raise standards
- Actively contribute to the work of the Governing Board
- Abide by the adopted Code of Practice

Once elected, a Parent Governor must act in the best interests of all pupils and not serve as a representative to lobby on behalf of their constituency.

## **Parent Governors:**

- Help determine priorities for school improvement
- Focus on the three core strategic functions of governance
- Work cooperatively with other Governors in the best interests of the school
- Attend meetings of the Governing Board and its Committees
- Promote the school's interests within the wider community
- Have an equal right to participate and express their views, while respecting the views of others
- Remain loyal to decisions made by the Governing Board
- Respect the confidentiality of designated confidential matters, and refrain from disclosing individual opinions or voting outcomes
- Withdraw from decisions where they, their partner, or a close relative may benefit, or where they are too personally involved to remain objective
- Recognise their broader responsibilities as Governors of a public institution, including promoting public accountability for the actions and performance of the Governing Board
- Participate in relevant training
